# Clinical Placements & Preceptorships:

UNDERGRADUATE NURSING PROGRAMS IN MICHIGAN

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#### Purpose of This Study


Nursing educators need more information about undergraduate clinical and preceptorship placements in Michigan in order to formulate suggestions for improving these critical educational activities:

#### **Data Collection**

- Statewide survey of clinical placement and preceptor coordinators at undergraduate RN programs
- Data for <u>calendar year</u> 2015
- On-line survey conducted August November 2016
- Design reviewed with members of the Education Advisory Team,
   Michigan Nursing Action Coalition
- Design help and administrative support provided by the Michigan Health Council
- Special thanks to clinical coordinators who took the time to participate in this survey

#### **Educational Settings and Placement Activities**

- Findings here are generally applicable to undergraduate nursing programs throughout Michigan
- Survey participants represent close to half of all undergraduate nursing programs in Michigan
- As expected:
  - Public universities provide almost all of the BSN education in Michigan
  - Community colleges provide most of the ADN education in Michigan

#### Clinical Training and Preceptorship Placements


#### CLINICAL TRAINING PLACEMENTS

- Coordinators at public universities and community colleges typically place hundreds of students in clinical settings each year
- Respondents facilitated more than 7,000 undergraduate clinical placements in 2015


#### PRECEPTOR PLACEMENTS

 Respondents facilitated almost 1,000 undergraduate preceptorships in 2015


## Undergraduate Clinical Placements and Preceptorships Facilitated in 2015



#### Average Placements per Program in 2015




### Clinical Hours Required for Undergraduate RN Students



#### Reported Difficulties in Placing Students

- Most respondents indicated some difficulty in placing undergraduate students for clinical rotations and preceptorships
- Most respondents reported at least some denials for clinical placements in 2015
- Clinical rotation denials:
  - Too many requests
  - Scheduling difficulties
- Preceptorship denials:
  - Too-few supervisors




# Overall Ease of Placing Students in Clinical Rotations


5 = Very Easy

0 = Very Difficult

- 71% of ADN Programs reported <u>some</u> clinical placement requests were denied
  - 113 requests denied.
- 67% of BSN Programs reported <u>some</u> clinical placement requests were denied
  - 50 requests denied.





## Clinical Placement Denials in 2015

#### **Preceptorship Placement Denials in 2015**






"Common" or "Very Common" Reasons for Denying Preceptorship Placements


#### **Clinical Placement Locations**

- Clinical placements sites for ADN and BSN student nurses are very similar
- Hospitals remain are the most common clinical training sites for all nursing students
- Non-traditional sites are much less common for all nursing students
- SIM Labs are also an important setting for both ADN and BSN student nurses to gain clinical experience

#### **Summary of Findings (1)**

- Michigan nursing schools are facilitating as many as 19,000 undergraduate clinical placements each year
- Up to 2,000 preceptorships per year
- The great majority of these placements are made by public universities and community colleges
- ADN students are required to complete an average of 550 hours of clinical training
- BSN students are required to complete an average of 575 hours
- Most coordinators report some difficulty in placing their students in clinical or preceptor placements

#### **Summary of Findings (2)**

- Too many requests and scheduling difficulties are the most common reasons for denying clinical placement requests
- Too few preceptors is the most common reason for denying preceptorship requests
- The most common ADN clinical settings are community hospitals, long-term care facilities, and SIM Labs
- The most common BSN clinical settings are community hospitals, specialty hospitals, and SIM Labs
- Non-traditional clinical sites are less often used to provide students with clinical training

## Moving Forward to Improve Clinical and Preceptorship Placements (1)

- 1. This survey confirms several issues about clinical training that have been reported anecdotally;
- 2. Use this survey as a basis for learning more about clinical training and preceptorships through:
  - a. Conduct a basic survey with nursing educators at Michigan hospitals and other clinical/preceptorship settings
  - b. Conduct interviews with clinical placement coordinators and nurse educators to gain detailed insights into:
    - Clinical placement and preceptorship hurdles or barriers
    - Best practices they have identified
    - Their suggestions for changes and improvements

## Moving Forward to Improve Clinical and Preceptorship Placements (2)

- 1. Use these findings to compare the processes of placing Michigan undergraduate RN students in clinical and preceptorship placements with those processes conducted elsewhere around the country
- 2. Use all these findings to craft meaningful policy and programmatic suggestions for improving these critical training activities
